

Quarterly Higher Education Emergency Student Relief Fund (HEERF) Report

Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) and American Rescue Plan (ARP)

Report Date: July 9, 2021 Reporting Period: Through June 30, 2021

Under CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) programs, student portion funds must be used to provide financial aid grants to students (including students exclusively enrolled in distance education) which may be used for any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care), or childcare. In making financial aid grants to students, the University must prioritize grants to students with exceptional need. Coppin State University (CSU) has signed and returned to the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSSA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

For CRRSAA funds, CSU recognizes that all students enrolled as of the award date of CRRSAA (May 14, 2021) were affected by the COVID-19 pandemic and therefore provided a pre-determined amount to all eligible students based on credit load status. Full time students received \$840 and part-time students received \$445.

For ARP funds, Student Economic Financial Hardship Applications will be required to be completed by each student requesting assistance. Students are to complete the application and forward to the Bursar's office by emailing the form to bursar@coppin.edu or mailing the form to the University. Students will also be instructed to provide supporting documentation for requests for funds beyond outstanding tuition and fees. Examples of additional documentation may include, but is not limited to, copy of utility cutoff notice, eviction notices, etc. The amount awarded to students will be based on decision of the review committee. Announcement of available emergency funds will be posted via CSU's website. The Bursar's office will communicate via email to all students regarding the availability of these funds. In addition, an announcement flyer, as well as the Student Economic Financial Hardship Assistance Application will be available via CSU's website.
